# Our dress code

The dress code at Herlufsholm School goes back a long way in our history - all the way back to the 1800s - and the ideas behind it are more relevant now than ever with our current special focus on wellbeing, learning and sustainability.

School clothing creates a sense of belonging within our school community for the students. This sense of belonging provides security and allows for academic development, which, in turn, fosters confidence and academic proficiency among students, contributing to an overall increase in well-being. Thus, the positive learning spiral is established. Furthermore, we see it as an advantage that students and parents do not have to invest in several wardrobes.

The dress code has a classic look and the colors are dark or medium blue and dark or medium gray:



All clothing should be well maintained, clean and appropriately sized. It is expected that students take care of their appearance in general. Clothing should fit properly and hair should be well-groomed and in natural colors.

Piercings in the ears are allowed. Tattoos must not be visible in everyday life.

The school's clothing supplier is Mister in Næstved. Mister provides guidance on the purchase of school clothing for boarding and day students. Mister has prepared a basic package for both boarding and day students. If you want to supplement the basic package, Mister will help you with this. Mister requests that you make an appointment at the store as early as possible. If needed, Mister can also provide tailoring assistance.

At the end of each school year, the school organizes a clothing bazaar with school clothes. Mister is also present here.

It is important that all clothing brought to school is labeled with the student's name. Name tags can be ordered from Mister, who sews names into all clothing purchased in the store.

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# **Clothing overview**

## Fullgala

Fullgala (formal wear) is a dark blue suit consisting of a double-breasted dark blue gala jacket with Herlovian buttons and trousers or a dark blue Herlovian blazer and a dark blue plain skirt in combination with a white shirt and a Gøye or Trolle tie. Add nice black shoes. This fullgala outfit is worn in the church on Trolle morning on January 14. For gala parties, the students wear the double-breasted dark blue suit with a white shirt and bow tie or a dress.

Fullgala is used at balls where indicated as well as at:

- Graduation
- Confirmation
- and Trolle Morning

# Halfgala

Semi-formal wear is composed of a gala jacket or Herlovian blazer and medium/dark gray skirt or pants, Herlovian shirt, Herlovian tie and black shoes. For seniors, it is possible to wear white trousers/ skirts, which are seen as a symbol and recognition of having reached the final year of high school. Halfgala is used at the school balls where indicated and

- When there are official guests at the school,
- On the first day of school and school Saturdays,
- On the school's anniversary and the Queen's birthday
- at oral tests and exams,
- on Constitution Day,
- on school picture day,
- at Forstanderjagt (the traditional hunt)
- and Christmas in church

# School clothing

- The light blue shirt is always worn during school hours.
- Skirt: solid blue or gray (not denim). No shorter than 15 cm above the knee.
- Pants: plain chinos in blue or gray.
- Shorts: Bermuda shorts in blue or gray, and no shorter than 15 cm above the knee.
- Shoes: deck shoes in blue. Simple black solid-colored shoes. Shoes/boots with high heels should not be worn during school hours. For middle school students, the heel of the shoe must not exceed 3 cm.
- Black sandals (without eye-catching embellishments) may be worn in the summer.
- Socks: dark blue or black
- Outerwear: solid blue or gray (no leather or fur). Outerwear may be supplemented with a cardigan, crew neck pullover, turtleneck or V-neck. These must be of a solid color in the school's blue or grey colors.
- All accessories (belts, scarves, hats, mittens, etc.) must be in the school's blue and grey colors. Belts may be black.

#### Leisurewear

During free time and after lunch (Mause) at the earliest, there is the option to supplement your school clothes with:

- solid colored classic jeans,
- school polo shirt,
- sneakers,
- and Herlufsholm hoodie, Herlufsholm sweatshirt or study trip sweatshirt.

#### **Sportswear**

- Sportswear with the school logo is worn in PE classes and for recreational sports, unless the activity requires special clothing.
- The student must have footwear for both indoor and outdoor sports. Footwear is of their own choice.

# **Overview and additional pieces of clothing**

It is possible to buy and sell used school clothes through our Facebook group "Buy/sell Herlufsholm school clothes", where parents can find information and contact each other about buying and selling used school clothes.

# At-school weekend

On Saturday after school and on Sundays, students may vary their school attire with the additional options in casual wear; however, everyone must wear a Herlovian shirt for breakfast and dinner.

## **Travel weekend**

When leaving the school, school and/or leisure clothing is worn. If students return to school in other clothing, they must change into school or leisure wear as soon as they return to school.

# **Field trips**

For field trips, study trips, theater visits and other events, students wear school, sports or leisure clothing, maybe halfgala, as per agreement with the teacher.

# Laundering of clothes and laundry bundle

The school's Linen Room offers washing of all parts of the clothing. Students drop off the bundle of dirty clothes in the Laundry on Thursday morning before breakfast and pick up the bundle of clean clothes in the Linen Room on Thursday morning after breakfast.

All student houses have a washing machine and dryer where students can do additional washing of e.g. sportswear. Students use the washing machine and dryer according to the student house instructions and at their own risk.

# **Dry cleaning**

Some of the Herlufsholm clothing cannot be washed, but should be dry cleaned when necessary. The Linen Room facilitates the intake and distribution of cleaned laundry from a local dry cleaner according to the calendar 'Bylt, linnedskift og rens' for the current school year. The cost of dry cleaning is settled quarterly via the dipel's student account.

The clothing regulations are drawn up by the school's standing clothing committee (students and management) and ad hoc clothing committees (day and boarding students across middle and secondary school, parents, boarding teachers and management).
